
Here it is:

Teddy class had the best attendance for the year with 96.66%. They were followed by Panda class with 95.24% and Koala with 93.90%.

<u>Cups and Awards:</u> Earlier today, we held our annual cup assembly. Most of the awards are focussed around learning – this might be to recognise the progress pupils have made for example. Others are for wider aspects of school life. We also handed out attendance awards. These were not just for 100% attenders – there were a few of these – but everyone who achieved attendance of over 98% for the year which equates to no more than three or four days of absence (obviously the higher the percentage, the fewer days of school missed). There were 23 children who achieved this which is 34% of the pupils in school. Here is a list of award winners including the 100% attendance pupils.

<u>Term Dates for Next Year:</u> Please see the attached document with the term dates for the next school year. As I have mentioned previously, while Devon County Council set the overall term dates, schools are able to choose when they have both their non-pupil days (five) and two occasional day each year. As these are often tagged on to the start or end of a term, it does mean different schools will have slightly different term dates so do always check not least if you have children at more than one school.
